Map	Represents an area of land or sea showing physical features, cities, roads etc.
Habitat	A place where an animal would naturally live in the wild.
Safari	A journey made overland to see animals in their natural environment.
Savannah	A large, grassy land with scattered trees often found in hot countries.
Compass	A hand held device used to locate directions on a map.
North, South, East and West	The main compass points.
