5 FACTS ABOUT REMEMBRANCE DAY

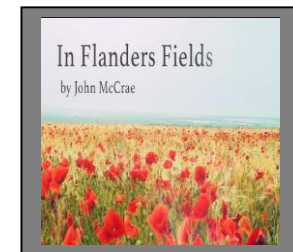
1. Remembrance Day is held on 11th November – the 11th day of the 11th month of the year.
2. A two minute silence is held at 11am to remember the soldiers who have fought in wars.
3. People wear poppies to show that they are thinking about the soldiers that have fought in the wars.
4. Poppies are worn on Remembrance Day because they are the flowers which grew on the battlefields after the First World War ended.
5. RBL (Royal British Legion) run the Poppy Appeal every year to raise money for men and women who have served or are serving in the Armed Forces. They raise money by selling poppies.
