



What is the Sports Premium?

This government initiative began with an investment of over £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools over the four academic years from 2013 to 2017. This funding has continued until 2024 on a yearly review basis. In good news for school sport, the funding has been made available next year as well. Schools have been given the control over how the money will be spent within the parameters of strict government criteria.

The table below shows the five key priority areas that the government states the sports premium money spend should focus on. Over the course of each academic year, we will ensure that all five objectives are invested in, whilst focussing more specifically on any of the key objectives that we feel need developing, in order to keep PE and sport provision at St. Andrew's at its current high level.

Here at St. Andrew's we are committed to delivering a wide ranging PE curriculum that is engaging and high in quality. This will ensure that teaching and learning opportunities in PE are high quality, meeting the needs of all pupils so that they may achieve their potential. This year we have been allocated **£18,000**, this sports premium money will allow us to further strengthen the quality of our PE lessons and also widen the opportunities available to children in lessons and at play times and encourage them to lead healthy lifestyles.

<u>Key Priorities: Objectives of the funding</u>
1. Health and Well-Being: A greater awareness amongst pupils about the dangers of obesity, smoking and other such activities that undermine pupils' health
2. Raising the profile of PE and sport for whole school improvement: How much more inclusive the physical education curriculum has become; the improvement in partnership work on physical education with other schools and other local partners; links with other subjects that contribute to pupils' overall achievement and their greater spiritual, moral social and cultural skills
3. Professional Development in PE: How much more inclusive the physical education curriculum has become; growth in the range of provisional and alternative sporting activities
4. Increasing the range of sports and activities on offer: The increase in participation rates in such activities as games, dance, gymnastics, swimming and athletics; the growth in the range of provisional and alternative sporting activities
5. Competitive Sport: The increase and success in competitive school sports

Sustainability

At St. Andrew's one of our aims for this funding is that there is a legacy after the funding stops. It is imperative that it is used and spent in a way that demonstrates long-term impact. We believe that investing in effective professional development in physical education and the purchasing of kits and equipment will fulfil this aim.

PE Awards and Recognition

We are very proud of our PE and sports provision at St. Andrew's. We achieved the platinum school games mark award in 2022 which is valid for two years. This award is recognition of the hard work, importance and emphasis we place on school sport.

Swimming

Swimming is part of the national curriculum and by the time the children leave St. Andrew's, all children should be able to swim 25metres. In our current year six **56/58** children can swim 25 metres. This slightly lower than normal figure can be put down to the covid-19 pandemic and closure of pools, especially during this cohort's lessons during the two of their years at KS2. Now that things are beginning to return to normality and facilities are open, we will use the sports premium funding to push all the children who cannot swim 25m towards this goal. We will continue to monitor the progress of children and their swimming as they progress through KS2 making sure we meet this target of every child swimming a length every year.

Scootfit is a new scheme based on high intensity interval training on scooters. It is brilliant for physical exercise. The health benefits are endless and it is delivered in such a fun activity that the children don't realise they are in fact exercising to such a high level.</p> <p>This activity helped us target our children's health and well being. The two days was so successful that it has given us the idea of purchasing our own equipment to run our own Scootfit sessions this will allow us to increase activity levels across the school and target our least active children in a fun way.</p>

<p>To pay for Horse Riding Lessons</p> <p><i>(Key Priority 2 and 4.)</i></p>	<p>We took 34 children to Cheshire Equestrian Centre and children had an hour and half where they were taught to ride and look after horses. <p>Staff CPD – Gymnastics</p> <p>Engaging Children in gymnastics.</p> <p><i>(Key Priority 2, 3 + 4.)</i></p>	<p>As a school we identified that for lots of teachers gymnastics was a difficult area of the PE curriculum to cover. To address this issue we have hired in Salford Leisure to run gymnastics sessions all year. Each year group will receive a half term of coaching and up skilling. They will then be able to use these ideas and lessons in their own teaching in the coming years. This is making sure we are using the funding to sustain high levels of teaching when the grants stop.</p> <p>Gymnastics is also a key area of the curriculum for the children. It is very different from most other aspects of the PE curriculum and these sessions will engage children in a different activity and hopefully encourage some to take up the sport in their free time.</p>
