Homework Books and Homework Clinic

The homework books have now been sent out and are all theme based and will link with the learning that is covered in class. We have chosen these books as they are designed to reinforce the learning from class but should not be too time onerous as they are no larger than 10 questions long. If children are stuck with any of the questions then Mr Watson will be holding a homework clinic on Thursday lunchtimes where children can drop into his class to get help with any specific questions that have caused them difficulty. It is important that homework is in class on the days below as we will be discussing answers and methods from part of that day's lesson as well as explaining next week's task.



Homework will then be sent out the same day to maximise the time children have to complete their work.

English Homework: Thursday to Thursday

Maths Homework: Monday to Monday

Spellings: Wednesday to Wednesday

Reading

Reading in Year 6 is as just as important as it was in Nursery when children were first learning to read. We mentioned at the assessment meeting how important reading is and the positive impact it can have on children's progress and we expect children to read at least twice a week at home as a minimum. Any child not reading at all during the week will have to miss a playtime to read to one of the Y6 staff members. Rewards are in place for those that read 3x or more a week, (at least once with an adult) to encourage children to read as much as possible. Building your child's reading stamina and fluency will have a massive positive impact on their reading and how they access their SATs, so please try to encourage it at home as much as possible.

Times Table Rockstars

Times tables are at the heart of the majority of maths topics we cover in year six. From finding %, to fractions, to area and volume and many more, having good times tables knowledge and speed of recall is imperative. For those children who find them difficult or are slow in recalling their tables, need to find time to visit the xtable rockstars app to practice!

PE Kits

In year six PE will be every Friday afternoon. Please can children have the correct kit in every week and can we remind you that children should have pumps and not trainers in their PE bag – thank you.

This term's learning

The first history topic that we are going to explore is a new one for year six – The Stone Age. In science we are studying light and electricity. During ICT children will be learning how to stay safe online as well as developing a variety of processing skills. Mr Johnson will be teaching Music to the children and Mrs Curran will be delivering our PSHE curriculum. Below is a further snippet of what will be going on during this term, each day will be jam-packed with interesting themes, topics and learning that the children will hopefully tell you all about at home!!

Prefects:

All year six children have been made a prefect and some prefects have already started their new roles and responsibilities. All children are required to do lunch duty one lunchtime every three weeks. Children will also be given further responsibilities throughout the year such as looking after the library, PE cupboard and office monitors to name just a few! Over the next week or two the teachers will be deciding on which four children will become our Head and Deputy Head Boys and Girls and we'll update you when the decision has been made. So far there are lots of candidates – we know it's going to be a very difficult decision to make!



Playtime, trips and after school club snacks

We have a number of children within the key stage who have life threatening food allergies – especially to nuts. Food allergies are severe and exposure in any form (skin contact or ingestion) to these substances could result in anaphylaxis, a potentially fatal condition that requires immediate medical attention. For the safety of the pupils we are implementing some restrictions in school. We are asking parents to be conscientious and understanding in their selection of snacks for KS2 children and packed lunches that they bring to school in an attempt to limit the chances of allergic reactions. The same rules apply to any after school clubs or trips that children attend.

We know that many parents like to celebrate birthdays and other occasions with special treats. We encourage parents to celebrate with non-nut based sweets. Any birthday sweets sent in to share with pupils should be pre-packaged and contain an ingredient label. Please give these items to your child's teacher for distribution. Please also instruct your child not to share food with other classmates at playtimes, on trips or after school clubs.
